RE: OYCR IS THE NEW DESIGNATED STATE AGENCY FOR TITLE II

I am writing to introduce the Office of Youth and Community Restoration (OYCR) within the California Health and Human Services Agency (CalHHS) as the new Designated State Agency (DSA) responsible for compliance monitoring under the federal Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDPA). As of July 1, 2024, OYCR received compliance monitoring and JJDPA inspection responsibilities from the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) for the following programs: *Minors in Detention (MID), Status Offenders and Federal Youth (SOFY) – Juvenile Facilities, and Minors in Court Holding (MCH-CH) (Pursuant to AB 169, Chapter 50 Statutes of 2024).* 

OYCR is actively engaged in ensuring that all facilities within our state adhere to the federal mandates outlined in the JJDPA, particularly focusing on the Core Requirements related to the safe and humane treatment of youth in custody. To facilitate this process, all applicable facilities must submit any required monthly and annual reports as well as JJDPA Separation Incident reports on a regular basis OYCR via email or mail at the contract information below.

## Reporting Requirements – Please note the following data/report requirements along with corresponding due dates:

<u>Monthly Reports:</u> (Secure or Nonsecure Detention Facilities) To include the number and duration of such minors held in detention each month via the Monthly Report on the Detention of Minors – Calendar Year 2024, due to OYCR by the 10<sup>th</sup> of the following month.

<u>Annual Reports:</u> These reports should include comprehensive data and information regarding the facility's compliance with the Core Requirements of the JJDPA. The reporting template and detailed instructions will be provided by OYCR.

<u>JJDPA Incident Reports:</u> In cases where significant incidents occur within the facility that may impact compliance with the JJDPA, incident reports must be submitted promptly. These reports should detail the nature of the incident, any actions taken, and steps for preventing future occurrences.

OYCR is actively engaged with our predecessor, the BSCC, to ensure a smooth transition of the JJDPA Compliance Monitoring requirements. We fully anticipate all reporting, surveys, and technical assistance to continue without disruption and request that any required reports and surveys be submitted to OYCR via email or mail.
