OYCR’s Legislative Team monitors all pending state and federal legislation impacting California’s youth justice continuum</p> <p>ii. All correspondence with legislators must be approved by the California Health and Human Services (CalHHS) Agency and Governor’s Office</p> <p>iii. The Legislative Team will assist the Policy and Legislative Advocacy Subcommittee with tracking and summarizing legislation</p>	OYCR

Appointed to the SACJJDP by former Governor Jerry Brown, Co-Chair Davis noted that previous SACJJDPs were able to provide feedback and influence policy and laws.</p> <p>ii. OYCR Chief Counsel Pandey noted Co-Chair Davis’ comments and explained that CalHHS requires that any communication with legislators be approved by the agency and Governor’s Office</p>	All

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. While the SACJJDPA Policy and Legislative Advocacy Subcommittee may not directly influence the creation of legislation, the Subcommittee may develop educational material on a variety of Title II issues, which may, through their publication, be used by external parties to develop legislation</li> <li>2. Darius noted that the Subcommittee may also advise OYCR on certain positions and policies that can help with the rehabilitation of youth in detention</li> <li>3. OYCR Chief Council Pandey shared that a pending bill, AB 1258 (Kalra), is an instance of pending litigation that is tied to the core requirements of the JJDP  <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. AB 1258 (Kalra) reauthorizes a pilot program which allows the counties of Nevada, Butte, and Santa Clara to defer entry of judgement for select youth between the ages of 18-25 and place them in a juvenile custodial setting for up to a year to receive developmentally-appropriate services.</li> <li>b. Co-Chair Porter noted that the Subcommittee could ask the pilot counties to present to the Subcommittee on the efficacy of their programs at a later meeting</li> </ol> </li> </ol> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>b.
