	 b. Prior to the Subcommittee meeting, Darius was informed by Dr. Carly Dierkhising that a Professor at California State University, Los Angeles, Dr. Maria León, was interested in joining. Darius recommended inviting Dr. León. c. Darius also recommended the chair of the San Mateo County Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention Commission (JJDPC), Johanna Rasmussen. Commissioner Rasmussen has been the lead organizer of the California Juvenile Justice Commissioners' Collaborative, a multi-county convening of Juvenile Justice Commissions (JJCs) and JJDPCs, which regularly inspect facilities for the same sight-and-sound separation requirements set by the Federal Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act (JJDPA). d. Darius further recommended Charlie Nguyen as a member of the subcommittee. Darius has connected with Charlie through other OYCR initiatives, and due to his lived experience navigating California's youth justice system, Darius believes Charlie would be an valuable addition to the subcommittee. i. Co-Chairs Porter and Davis approved these recommendations. Darius will reach out to Dr. Leon, Commissioner Rasmussen, and Charlie Nyugen, with an invitation to join the Subcommittee.

aterial on a variety of Title II issues, which ay, through their publication, be used by ternal parties to develop legislation i. In the last meeting, OYCR Chief Council Pandey shared that a pending bill, AB	
1258 (Kalra), is an instance of pending litigation that is tied to the core requirements of the JJDPA. 1. Co-Chair Porter requested that Darius share out updates on AB 1258 (Kalra), which would extend a deferred entry of judgment pilot program for transitioned-aged youth in the counties of Butte, Nevada, and Santa Clara, and AB 1376 (Bonta), which would place a presumptive one-year limit on the terms of probation a youth may serve in the community. -Chair Davis suggested that the bcommittee focus on understanding why the nsitional-aged, deferred judgment program d remained a pilot program for over 9 years. i. Co-Chair Porter agreed -Chair Davis noted that the Subcommittee ald ask the pilot counties to present to the bcommittee on the efficacy of their programs a later meeting and could conduct site visits the counties implementing this promising actice. Illowing the completion of the site visits, the bcommittee could analyze the data to derstand whether this practice should be commended by the SACJJDP to be adopted
